WEN's KC Job Fairs held annually in May and in October, continue to succeed as events for both employers and job seekers. Both Job Fairs estimated attendance was over 400 job seekers. In May, there were 60 vendors and in October, 70. A variety of industries attended, including: banking, nonprofit, healthcare, technology, local and federal government, food and hospitality, legal, education, staffing, transportation, and media relations. Job Fair vendor surveys showed most participants were very satisfied and more than half of the vendors are extremely likely to participate in the future.

### rosa


Rosa heard about WEN while living in another state and found that WEN was unique to Kansas City. When she moved to KC, along with her two children to be with her family, she looked WEN up and made a commitment to herself by joining the program. As the sole income provider in her household, she was working two jobs to make ends meet. At WEN, she learned how valuable her bilingual skills were. She could not attend the Job Fair in October but her WEN classmates, who became her support network during the class, passed out her resume to companies she identified. One Human Resources Manager, with Imperial PFS, was so impressed by the rave reviews from her cohort (and her resume), she reached out to WEN to set up an interview with Rosa. WEN is excited to announce that Rosa was offered a position as a Bilingual Customer Service Representative with full benefits – a connection she might have missed without the KC Job Fair.



## 2018-2019 FINANCIALS

Since 2009, WEN has balanced its budget and increased cash reserves, resulting in strong financial sustainability for the organization. The Finance Committee remains diligent in monitoring our cash flow and sources of revenue in concert with our Board of Directors.
