PRESIDENT'S STATEMENT

As I reflect on the last fiscal year, two words come to mind – determination and commitment. We continued to see changes in our community and clients as we rebuilt post pandemic.

The women we serve – still on unsure footing – entered back into the workforce at a slower rate than expected, but the community stood behind these women and WEN by committing their support. Our clients, determined to make a better future for themselves and their families, stayed engaged with our services and we continued to deliver online components and until we were sure we would be able to come back in person.

In September of 2021, we offered a reworked, more condensed version of our signature 5-week program to ease our clients into in-person classes, once again. We started offering enhanced content to complement our online workshops in a hybrid, three-day-a-week model, which worked well in our ever-changing world.

We went full-steam ahead with in-person events and held our annual luncheon in April to a small, yet mighty crowd of just over 800 guests in attendance.



The commitment of our sponsors, partners, and community was inspiring – exceeding our expectations. The KC Job Fair followed in June and we once again were able to assist employers and job seekers meet in person and face-to face.

My team and I are excited as we look ahead to the upcoming year and beyond as WEN continues to make a difference in Kansas City — one woman at a time.

For over three decades, WEN has helped women in Kansas City on their journey to financial independence. In 2022, we gathered back in person for the first time in two years.

With over 800 supporters in the room, we celebrated our clients and heard how these women are discovering their own direction as they navigate new pathways to success.



KC Job Fairs are held twice annually annually, but as we still were recovering from the pandemic in 2021, we held four virtual KC Job Fairs to accommodate the slow return to in-person events. In June of 2022, we were in-person at the KC Job Fair for the first time since October of 2019. In 2021-2022, WEN assisted 56 employers seeking to hire new talent.
